- New features:
 - Completely paperless!

2 GHATD Events - What Worked Well

- Online registration and payment for GHATD
 - Helps in planning for gear, coaches, volunteers
 - Skaters PayPal before the session
- Loaner gear
 - Sizes separated into color coded mesh bags
 - No need to borrow gear from league members
 - Rolling racks for easy transport of gear
- Onsite storage at San Mateo
 - No need to rent a locker
 - No need to get a Uhaul to move everything to the rink and back
- Gear Sale
 - Suit up for a fraction of the cost of new gear
 - All donated gear is put to use
- Register immediately after session
- Participation/league growth = 10-15 per GHATD

Girls Garage by the numbers:



- 6 years in operation
- Approximately 200 girls ages 9-17 attend per year
- 28 after-school, summer, and weekend programs per year
- 73% of our girls are repeat participants
- 73% are girls of color
- 58% attend Girls Garage at no- or low-cost
- 116 projects built by girls

Player Safety: Code of Responsibility

- NCWHL follows USA Hockey Rules and in addition, we set the following expectations for the way we play:
- Players are responsible not only for their actions on the ice, but also for being aware of the other players on the ice and being able to act in a responsible manner for the safety of all players.
- For violations of the NCWHL Code of Responsibility, players are subject to league discipline as summarized below.
 - First offense: warning
 - Second offense: one game suspension
 - Third offense: three game suspension
 - Additional offense: expulsion
- For particularly egregious violations, the Board reserves the right to employ stricter discipline than the progression dictates.
